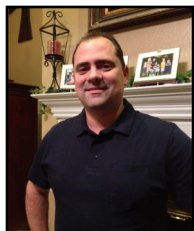

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Private Option Best for Chiropractic

With the Legislature meeting in fiscal session in February and March, many Chiropractic Physicians and members of the Arkansas Chiropractic Physicians Association (ACPA) have been wondering: How does “Obamacare” affect me? While opinions about the Affordable Care Act (ACA) vary from strongly opposed to strongly in favor, there are some elements of the ACA, and its unique implementation in Arkansas, that are very beneficial to Chiropractic Physicians and their patients.

Part of the original ACA included a mandatory expansion of Medicaid to cover previously uninsured people, with the federal government covering 100% of the cost for the first three years and no less than 90% after that. However, in 2012 the U.S. Supreme Court made this expansion voluntary. Almost immediately, many state legislatures opposed to Obamacare refused to expand Medicaid as a show of opposition to the Act. Arkansas, however, chose to chart a path-finding middle course. Arkansas pursued a waiver from the federal government to take the funds designated for the Medicaid expansion and use them to buy private health insurance for those eligible for coverage.

As you now know, the so-called "Private Option" was adopted by the Legislature in the 2013 session after a massive lobbying effort by many health care groups, including the ACPA. However, the Private Option is in big trouble at the legislature. The program has to be funded every year moving forward, and there is doubt that the votes will be there to continue it beyond July 2014. This should be of grave concern to every Chiropractic Physician in the state.

Here's the bottom-line reason on why: Chiropractic is included as an “Essential Health Benefit” under ACA. Specifically, the ACA mandates coverage for rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices to help patients “gain or recover mental and physical skills lost to injury, disability or a chronic condition. Plans have to provide 30 visits each year for either physical or occupational therapy, or visits to the chiropractor” without a referral. As you know, Medicaid has very poor coverage for Chiropractic, allowing only 12 visits a year and only after a referral from a Primary Care Physician. Thus the Private Option was a much better option for Chiropractic patients than Medicaid.

When Arkansas decided to pursue the Private Option rather than expand Medicaid, there was some debate as to whether the policies offered to that group of people had to include all the essential health benefits or if it could just mirror Medicaid's lesser benefits. In fact, the first iteration of policies offered by Blue Cross Blue Shield for the Private Option did not explicitly include Chiropractic coverage. During the 2013 session, ACPA successfully lobbied the Governor and Legislature to clarify that these policies had to fully comply with the Affordable Care Act and that Chiropractic should be included. This was a big win for the profession.

To date, over 80,000 previously uninsured people have signed up for insurance coverage throughout the private option. That's 80,000 Arkansans who now have an insurance policy that covers up to 30 chiropractic visits a year. The state projects that by the end of 2014 over 250,000 people will have coverage through the Private Option, unless it is discontinued.

In short, it is in the best interest of Chiropractic patients and Physicians that the Private Option be renewed in the 2014 Fiscal Session. It's important that ACPA members are educated on the details of the ACA so they can speak with authority to patients and legislators alike. As a review of the essential health benefits, please refer to the article below.

ACPA will be providing information in the coming weeks stressing the importance to Chiropractic and the need to rally the ACPA troops to encourage renewal of the program.

Lee has an herbal practice in Brisbane Australia where he lives with his wife and two children.

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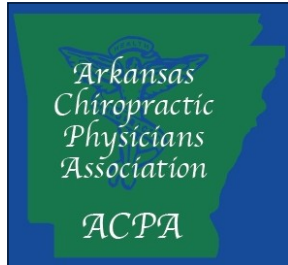

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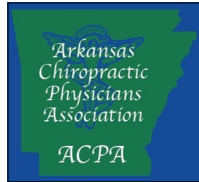
